Taking place at Daytona Outdoor Karting venue at Sandown, you'll take to the 900m track, which offers eight challenging corners and several straights with plenty of overtaking opportunities.

With only 34 teams available of up to 5 drivers, you'll have the opportunity to practice before taking part in a Le Mans style endurance race over a 2.5hr period.

You'll also have the opportunity to meet Damon Hill OBE, patron and co-founder of halow project, and race against him, as well as other professional drivers, celebrities, businesses and individuals.

When you're not blasting around the track, you can relax in the race day marquee. There are also food and drink options available. On completion of the race, the bar will be open, and a prize giving ceremony will take place, followed by an auction to raise those all important funds for **halow**.

Tom's halow journey

By taking part in this unique fundraising event you can enjoy the thrill of the drive whilst raising vital funds to support young people with learning disabilities and autism.

From the humblest of beginnings (one room and one person), halow has developed beyond all expectations. We now employ over 60 members of staff, with over 40 support workers and many volunteers. We currently support over 300 young people in their quest to lead meaningful, independent lives. In less than 20 years, we have become a significant organisation; seen as a specialist in our field, not only by young people and their parents, but also by the local authority and the wider third sector.

"After I left college, I started doing Building Futures. It was very different from college but much better. We did a lot of things I haven't done before like driving a canal boat and using public transport like buses and trains. We learnt how to plan trips for the group, and I planned a trip to the Watercress Line in Hampshire and a singing workshop. I really enjoyed my three years on Building Futures. Sometimes we got really wet and tired, but we had a lot of laughs and learnt a lot, I know my way around Guildford very well.

"One of the places we went to sometimes was Birtley House in Bramley to find out about growing things in a garden. After Building Futures I decided to try Cook and Grow through halow's A Reason to Get Up programme, where I learnt more about how to grow to food to eat. We also learnt how to cook the food that we grew. We grew so many strawberries we all took loads home and I made jam with my mum. Best jam ever!

"In the pandemic I found it very tough. halow supported me do a couple of hours a week volunteering in the kitchen garden at Birtley House in Bramley. With support from halow I got the opportunity to have a part time job as an Assistant Gardener at Birtley House. While I am there I have support with me. I have learnt to do a lot more and have successfully finished my probation period, so I am now part of the gardening team. I am very lucky to have this job and the continued support from halow."
